

## Facility Operations History

1911 – 1918: The Dryden Timber and Paper Company

1918 – 1920: The Dryden Pulp and Paper Company (name change)

1920 – 1953: Dryden Paper Company (name change)

1953 – 1960: Anglo – Canadian (purchase of the mill; name on the mill doesn't change)

1960 – 1975: Reed Paper Group (buys A-C which includes the Dryden Paper Company)

[**1960 - 1975** - Dryden Chemicals Ltd. (Reed subsidiary) runs a chlor-alkali facility on-site]

1975 – 1979: Reed Limited (company name change)

1979 – 1988: Great Lakes Forest Products (company name change)

1988 – 1994: Canadian Pacific Forest Products (merger: GLFP + Canadian Int. Paper)

1994 – 1998: Avenor Inc. (company name change)

1998: Bowater (buys Avenor)

1998 – 2007: Weyerhaeuser Company (buys the mill from Bowater)

2007 – Bowater merges with Abitibi Consolidated Inc. to become BowaterAbitibi

2012 – BowaterAbitibi changes name to Resolute Forest Products

2007 – 2021: Domtar (purchase of the mill from Weyerhaeuser Company)

2021 – 2023: Paper Excellence Group (buys Domtar)

2023 – Paper Excellence Group buys Resolute Forest Products

2023 – now: First Quality (buys the mill from Domtar/Paper Excellence Group)
